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From the Principal

NAPLAN 2018 Update

During Term Two on the 15th, 16th and 17th of May, all schools across the country will be sitting for NAPLAN testing. Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students sit the test and it provides schools with a measure of growth data over an 8-year period. This data is the only national data that we have and is quite helpful for teachers when planning in order to meet student learning needs.

Teachers and schools however do collect data from a variety of programs, learning exercises that also help support and complete an overall picture of what each child's learning needs are. PAT testing in Science, Reading and Maths are other ways we collect data. Running Records and Lexiles are reading-centred. Class teachers also collect baseline data, assess students in class and collect many other forms of data through observations.

The NAPLAN test is a snapshot on the day and does not provide educators with a complete picture of their learning needs. As we come closer to testing time, you may wish to have a talk with your child's classroom teacher about the test. In certain cases students can either be exempted or withdrawn. If you wish to discuss this, please contact the school and ask to make a time to meet with your child's teacher or with Sarah Magnusson or myself.

PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Families would have now received notes for parent interviews that are being held during Week 9 and Week 10. Please make sure you take up this opportunity as it will give you insight as to how your child has settled in, any possible learning challenges they may face with their learning or how well they are doing.

Parent interviews are also an excellent opportunity for you to raise any concerns you may have, query things that you may not be sure off and celebrate the successes your child has had with their learning. We are looking forward to seeing you during the week.

Screening Clearance Reminder

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance and participation in schooling is an important factor in educational and life success. All children between the ages of 6 and 16 years are required by law to attend school regularly. Parents/Caregivers have the responsibility to ensure children in their care regularly attend school between the ages of 6 and 16 years. If students miss the basic skills in the early years of school, they often experience difficulties later.

The school day starts at 8:50am. It is expected that all students are at school just prior to 8:50am so that they have time to get organised for their day of learning.


CANTEEN
