# Online Screening Applications: General Information

Relevant History screening applications are done **online**. Volunteers are unable to start an online DCSI screening on their own - an organisation must initiate an application on their behalf. Please contact the school's Front Office if you would like to volunteer at our site (and do **not** already have a current DCSI 'Child-Related' screening clearance). To start your application you will need to provide us with your full name, date of birth and a current email address. You will also need to indicate where/how you will be volunteering in our school. This information will pre-populate your application form and you will then **not** be able to change the information without consulting with the school.

When the school has successfully initiated an application on your behalf, you will receive the first of 2 emails from the DCSI Screening Unit advising that an application has been initiated on your behalf. Click on 'Activate My Account' in your email. You'll then receive a second email from DCSI with your personal account login details, username and password and further information so that you can proceed with your application.

Should you need assistance with the online screening application process, contact the helpful DCSI staff (phone 1300 321 592, then press 2 for online help).

It is important that online applications are completed in a timely fashion. When you receive your clearance letter from DCSI, please bring the **ORIGINAL** into the Front Office so that we can sight it.

Clearances are valid for 3 years. **Keep your original clearance safe** as **neither DCSI nor the school issue replacements for/copies of lost or misplaced letters.** The onus is on you as a volunteer to take steps to start a new application **prior to** any existing (DCSI) clearance expiring.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

Please be aware that it is the policy of Aberfoyle Hub R-7 School that ALL volunteers at our site need a DCSI 'Child-related Employment Screening'. Exceptions will only apply if agreed to by the Principal.

# Skoolbag App


Our school has it's own Skoolbag iPhone and Android App to help us communicate more effectively with our parent/ student community. To install our Skoolbag School App, just search for our school name (Aberfoyle Hub R-7 School) in either the Apple App Store or Google Play Store. For Windows users, search for Skoolbag in the Windows Store and install the app and then find our school. **Please note:** it must be a Windows 8.1 or 10 device.

App users will be prompted to register with a username and password. This will enable users to save their Group Subscription settings across devices. Users will be sent an email address to verify their account, however you will not be prevented from logging into the app. Once users login, they will be able to personalize their group and notification preferences.

All recent, unseen notifications can be found by clicking the bell icon in the top right corner of the app.

# October is Dyslexia Awareness Month!



**Dyslexia** is a language based learning difficulty which is neurological in origin. It has nothing to do with vision or intelligence. Dyslexics find reading and spelling very difficult, they are often years behind their peers. Working memory, organisation, concentration and sequencing of

tasks are also challenging. There is no cure and it affects 1 in 5 people. Some people can have mild dyslexia while others can be severe.

Unfortunately, school failure can also cause anxiety, behavioural and school avoidance issues. Helping a student with dyslexia requires a collaborative and multi-disciplinary approach between parents, teachers, tutors (dyslexia specialists or speech pathologists) and psychologists. The great news is, dyslexics can achieve success in literacy with the right intervention and professional hep.

Doctors or behavioural optometrists cannot assist with a dyslexia diagnosis. An educational assessment is needed from an accredited Educational Psychologist or Speech Pathologist. SPELD SA has a wealth of information to assist parents and students, including the Understanding Learning Difficulties Parents Guide which is available on their website (speld-sa.org.au).

This year I have set up an information display in the staff room for teachers to learn more about dyslexia and share resources. Other great sources of information for parents and teachers include:

Code Read Dyslexia Network is a recently established national charity. We have had great success in South Australia through our advocacy which has resulted in the introduction of the Year One Phonics Check and the Literacy Guarantee Unit in the Department for Education. Literacy coaches are currently being rolled out in all public schools and workshops are taking place across the state for teachers and parents.

A compound word is two smaller words joined together. For syllable division we always split between each word. There are usually 4 consonants between vowels in compound words e.g. dish/cloth, grand/child, with/stand, match/box, grand/slam, crank/shaft.



Log-in to www.scholastic.com.au/LOOP or download our iPhone and iPad app from the App Store or get it on Google Play for Android.

- For a quick start, just click on ORDER in the top menu or REGISTER first to save your details for next time
- Select your school and your child's class
- · Add your child's first name and last initial (so the school knows who the book is for)
- Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogues
- You can order for multiple children at once if they attend the same school
- All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will still be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date
- There's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details to your school!

# In-School Psychology Counselling Service

A psychologist is available at our school. Counselling is a very effective way of helping children and adolescents who are struggling with some aspects of their lives, from feeling anxious or depressed, to experiencing bullying or having difficulties controlling their anger. It can help them to recover and also help prevent re-occurrence.

To access this free counselling service you will need to:

- •Complete the GP information form provided to you by us.
- •Take the letter along with your child to your local GP to obtain a Mental Health Care Plan referral from your GP.
- Complete the In-School Psychology consent form and return it to school together with the GP referral.

We will then be in contact with you as to when the psychologist will start working with your child. For further information please contact the school.
