From the Principal

NAPLAN 2019 UPDATE

NAPLAN testing occurs across the country in Term 2 on May 14th, 15^h and 16th with Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students sitting the test. This data is the only national data that we have and is quite helpful for teachers when planning in order to meet student learning needs. Teachers and schools collect data from a variety of programs and learning exercises that also helps support and complete an overall picture of each child's learning needs. PAT testing in Science, Reading and Maths are other ways we collect data. Running Records and Lexiles are reading-centred. Class teachers also collect baseline data, assess students in class and collect many other forms of data through observations.

One new initiative for this year is that all of our students will be engaging with NAPLAN testing online. We have run tests with our computers to make sure they are able to support online testing, which the network was able to cope with during the tests. NAPLAN Online testing will occur over two weeks in Term 2 from May 14th to 24th. The NAPLAN test is a snapshot on the day and does not provide educators with a complete picture of student learning needs. As we come closer to testing time, you may wish to talk with your child's classroom teacher about the test. In certain cases, students can either be exempted or withdrawn. If you wish to discuss this, contact the school and ask to make a time to meet with your child's teacher or with Sarah Magnusson or myself.

PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Families would have now received notes for parent interviews being held during Week 9. Please ensure you take up this opportunity as it will give you insight as to how your child has settled in, any possible learning challenges they may face or how well they are doing. Parent interviews are also an excellent opportunity for you to raise any concerns, query things that you may not be sure of and celebrate the successes your child has had with their learning. We are looking forward to seeing you during the week. As many of you are now aware we have, for the first time, introduced a new online app 'School Interviews' for booking parent/student/teacher interviews. At this point I am pleased to report that initial feedback from various parents/caregivers has been quite positive. Our goal is to eventually transition to this new system as a way of conducting our bookings and eventually stop using the paper method of booking interviews. For those of you who find the online systems daunting, please do not hesitate to request for help from your child's teacher. They are more than happy to assist as the app is quite user friendly. If you have any feedback about the new app 'School Interviews', please let us know as we would like to hear your thoughts about a new way of doing things at Aberfoyle Hub R-7 School.

BULLY AUDIT

We at the Hub are committed to creating a supportive school environment, free from bullying, harassment and violence. Our message is that we say 'no way' to bullying in all shapes and forms including cyber bullying, physical violence and intimidation. There is no place for bullying or violence in or outside of our schools. We continually encourage children to talk about and be more aware of the impacts of bullying.

MANAGING BULLYING AT THE HUB

It is important for our school community to continuously look at ways to monitor and improve procedures to reduce harassment and bullying incidents. Research shows that bullying can have a significant impact on learning and relationships if not dealt with effectively. To further strengthen our work in ensuring that our school is a safe, happy and harassment-free environment for students, staff and families we will be conducting an R - 7 Bullying Audit in Week 9 this term and again in Term 3.

What is a Bully Audit?

The audit involves students completing a series of questions, with support of their class teacher, asking them if they have been bullied recently, including what and where it happened.

What happens with this information?

Class teachers collate the information that the students provide on a tally sheet. Conversations will be had with any students who are identified through this process. Discussions will centre on what needs to improve/change to support positive behaviour. Sometimes students can be involved in bullying without realising that their actions are affecting others. Data collected will be used to inform and improve our practice in order to keep Aberfoyle Hub R-7 School a safe place for everyone.

Will families be notified?

Families will be contacted to inform them if their child has been identified through the process and a meeting arranged where applicable.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance and participation in schooling is an important factor in educational and life success. All children between the ages of 6 and 16 years are required by law to attend school regularly. Parents/Caregivers have a responsibility to ensure children in their care regularly attend school between the ages of 6 and 16 years. If students miss the basic skills in the early years of school, they often experience difficulties later. The school day starts at 8:50am. It is expected that all students are at school just **prior to 8:50am** so they've time to get organised for their day of learning.

At the Hub it is policy to notify the school before 9:30am if your child is away for any reason. Please notify the school using the Skoolbag app or, alternatively, email the class teacher or the school. If your child is late they must come to the Front Office to be signed in.

Did you know? Everyday Counts

10 minutes late every day = 50 minutes per week = nearly 1^{1/2} weeks per year 1 day away each fortnight = 20 days per year = 4 weeks per year Remember 90% attendance = 1 day off a fortnight
