

Welcome Back

Welcome back to Term Two. I hope everyone has had a wonderful and restful break. This term will be very busy for us with upcoming NAPLAN testing and school camps just to name a few highlights for this term.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process - it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance. NAPLAN provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

This year our students will sit NAPLAN online. Feedback in the first year of NAPLAN Online showed that students engaged well with online assessments. One of the main benefits of NAPLAN Online is tailored (or adaptive) testing, where the test automatically adapts to a student's test performance. The test presents questions of higher or lower complexity, depending on a student's performance. Tailored (or adaptive) testing is designed to assess a wider

range of student abilities and to measure student achievement more precisely. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions more challenging than usual; they may be taking a more complex test pathway. A student's overall NAPLAN score is based on the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. NAPLAN Online is not a test of keyboard skills. There are variations in how fast and well a student can type – just as there are variations in how fast and well a student can write by hand. Year 3 students will complete the writing test on paper.

Students with disability may qualify for adjustments that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments. You should first discuss the use of any disability adjustments for your child with your child's teacher. A formal exemption may be granted for a student with disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or for a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background. Both Sarah Magnusson and I are able to assist you with more information on NAPLAN Online disability adjustments or the process required to gain a formal exemption.

Parents also have the option to request to withdraw their child from NAPLAN testing. Again, as above, I would ask you to meet with your child's teacher or ask to speak to either Sarah Magnusson or myself.

As part of the Health and PE curriculum, R-5 mainstream students will be involved in a 1-week daily swimming program in Week 6. Term 2

Reminder: students do not need to wear hats this term unless the UV Index is 3 or above. This is a great way to soak up the sun (and some vitamin D, vital for strong bones and overall health) as UV radiation levels start to fall from mid-May until the end of July. Find out how much sun you need for vitamin D here by clicking How much sun is enough.

Students are to wear hats in Terms 1, 3 & 4 or whenever the UV Index is 3 or above. To check the daily sun protection times in your area, go to the SunSmart app, or www.myuv.com.au. Remember, it's UV

and not heat that causes skin damage.





HEALTH News Asthma

We know that asthma can be triggered by a range of factors, including pollutants in the air we breathe. To minimise your risk, you should consider indoor air quality and the significant impact it can have on your health and wellbeing. Poor indoor air quality and exposure to indoor pollutants can trigger asthma attacks, especially for those who are more susceptible like small children.

Common pollutants

Common indoor pollutants you might be exposed to include:

- 1. Pollen.
- 2. Pet dander tiny particles of skin that have been shed by your pet, like dandruff!
- 3. Mould.
- 4. Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) - chemical compounds found in paints, furnishings and building products.

If you have asthma, it is important to always be aware of indoor air quality wherever you spend your time. It's best to make choices for your home that minimise your exposure to the pollutants that trigger your asthma.

AusPollen Apps

When pollen monitoring data is readily available we know people with asthempowered to better manage their condition. Asthma Australia has partnered with AusPollen (@pollenforecast) to pollen monitoring and Partnership is Australia's first standardised national pollen monitoring network. It aims to assist allergy and asthma patients with accurate, localised pollen information based on robust data collection.
