From the Principal

Enrolments/Planning 2020

We will soon be sending out notices about placement requests for the new school year. Staff will begin to work through the class placement process early next term. Once class models are determined the placement of children will be made by teachers and that is based on how we best meet the needs of the child's learning and social wellbeing. Parent requests are then looked at and, if we are able to, we will always try our best to meet such requests. At times however, this is not possible due to various reasons. If you have children to enrol or know of families looking to enrol their children, please enrol as soon as possible or encourage families to come and visit us. We would like the opportunity to show what we have to offer students at Aberfoyle Hub.

NAPLAN

We are expecting that all NAPLAN results will be sent to the school during Week 9 of this term. Once the school has received all respective results these will be sent home via your child.

I am pleased to share that results for 2019 have improved in all year levels compared to 2018. Looking at current results I can share with you that in Reading we have had 82.9% of students meet the Department for Education targets for Year 3. For our Year 5 students this figure has grown from 76.9% to 91.9% and Year 7 from 71.1% to 78%. We have also had recorded growth in students moving from the middle bands of attainment to the higher bands for Reading. Those students demonstrating higher band attainment data indicates growth for Year 3 in Reading 46.3% to 54.3%, Year 5 from 30.8% to 48.6% in those groups and Year 7 from 22.2% to 29.3%. In Numeracy the trend in improvement is

also reflected with Year 3 middle band attainment growing from 69% to 82.9%, Year 5 from 76.9% to 78.4% and Year 7 from 75.6% to 80.5%. Students who have demonstrated higher band attainment in Year 3 remained around the high 30%, Year 5 in the lower 20% range and Year 7 growing from 15.6% to 26.8%.

As we continue to implement the new Improvement cycle and build on new agreements such as our Writing genre agreements, Literacy and Numeracy our goal will remain in continuing to improve and provide better learning outcomes for all of our students.

MORNING DROP OFF

I would like to remind families that school expectations are that children are to be dropped off at school from 8:30am onwards during all mornings. Prior to this time we do not have staff out doing yard duty. Please refrain from having your child at school before this time. We have an OSHC service for you to use if you require to drop off your child due to changing personal reasons.

ICAS TESTING

Last week students began to sit for ICAS testing in various subject areas. This year for the first time the testing process has been set online, apart for writing. Due to this being new, UNSW Global have had some technical issues with the administration of the tests.

To help support students and schools, UNSW Global have given all school sites extension on dates as to when children can sit for the test. You may notice that your child may not sit for a test on the day originally specified. Please rest assured however, they will sit for tests you have requested, only on a different day.


Colgate Community Garden Challenge

YEAR 7 TO HIGH SCHOOL

Parent Update

Week 5, Term 3 - 2019

Year 7 will be taught in high school from term 1, 2022.

This means from 2022, year 6 will be the last year of primary school and yea 7 will be the first year of high school.

This is a big change for our public education system. We'll be providing regular updates about the move and what it means for your child.

Why we're moving year 7

Year 7 is already part of high school across the country, so we're bringing South Australia in line with the rest of Australia, and with other education systems in our state.

The planning process

We'll be ready for the move in 2022. We've done our hornework to make sure there's enough space at high schools. We're investing \$185m in our schools to manage increasing enrolments, which includes providin general and specialist learning areas.

Benefits for your child

Your child's learning is our priority and we want to make sure they get the best learning opportunities from their new high school environment.

The Australian Curriculum for year 7 was designed to be taught in high school, and your child will benefit from specialist teachers in specialist high school facilities.

We can see in many of our R – 12 schools, and from the interest in our pilot schools, that year 7s are ready and keen for high school.

Dental for Schools Oral health Program

Is visiting our school to provide dental check-ups and treatment/s onsite. The program is run with the help of Medicare and the Child Dental Benefit Schedule (CDBS) so all children who are eligible* pay no out of pocket expense. The mobile dental clinic will arrive on the specified dates and will only see children who have filled in a **Medicare** consent form.

You will receive an oral health report which will have information on your child's visit and notes written by the dental team as well as any necessary referrals at the end of the visit if treatment could not be completed on site. 1 in 2 Aussie kids have a decayed tooth, with your help we hope to reduce these numbers within South Australia by 2021. Please fill in the consent form that has already been sent home and return this to the front office or your child's teacher by September 16th 2019.
