



#### COVID-19

#### **NAPLAN**

Next term all of our Year 3, 5 and 7's will sit for NAPLAN during Weeks 3 and 4. Prior to this testing our school has also been asked to be part of the Equating study. All of our children will be tested prior to NAPLAN as part of ACARA study in relation to the NAPLAN initiative. NAPLAN is a great tool for tracking students over a set period of time. It measures growth of our children and assists with data that teachers already collect in planning to meet student learning leads. This may also be the time for you to make a time and chat with your child's teacher about NAPLAN and any concerns or questions you may have about NAPLAN. Last year we had all of our students sit for NAPLAN online. This year all testing, apart from Year 3 writing, will be held online.

#### PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS

All families should have received a note electronically via Dojo, through Skoolbag or in hard copy form about our upcoming interviews with your child's teacher. All booking for this year has been set online as feedback last year was in favour of this format. Please make sure you make a time to meet and talk with your child's class teacher. This is a good time to learn about your child's learning and what support they may require to help them to achieve their learning goals. If you are experiencing any issues with bookings, please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher to find a solution. Interview times begin Tuesday of next week and conclude Monday of Week 10.

# **BULLY AUDIT**

We at the Hub are committed to creating a supportive school environment, free from bullying, harassment and violence. Our message is that we say 'no way' to bullying in all shapes and forms including cyber bullying, physical violence and intimidation. There is no place for bullying or violence in or outside of our schools. We continually encourage children to talk about and be more aware of the impacts of bullying.

#### MANAGING BULLYING AT THE HUB

It is important for our school community to continuously look at ways to monitor and improve procedures to reduce harassment and bullying incidents. Research shows that bullying can have a significant impact on learning and relationships if not dealt with effectively. To further strengthen our work in ensuring that our school is a safe, happy and harassment-free environment for students, staff and families we will be conducting an R - 7 Bullying Audit in Week 9 this term and again in Term 3.

#### What is a Bully Audit?

The audit involves students completing a series of questions, with support of their class teacher, asking them if they have been bullied recently, including what and where it happened.

#### What happens with this information?

Conversations will be had with any students identified through this process. Discussions will centre on what needs to improve/change to support positive behaviour. Sometimes students can be involved in bullying without realising that their actions are affecting others. Data collected will be used to inform and improve our practice in order to keep our school to be a safe place for everyone.

#### Will families be notified?

Families will be contacted to inform them if their child has been identified through the process and a meeting arranged where applicable.

# DYSLEXIA SA: FUN PHONICS

#### Fact 3 - Decoding, Phonics & Sight Words

Once children understand the sound structure of words and their written representations they are ready to "crack the code" by linking letter patterns and speech patterns to decode words. They can do this by blending and segmenting. Blending is joining individual speech sounds (phonemes) together to make a real word. This is a crucial phonemic awareness skill as being able to mentally join speech sounds together to make real words helps children decode unfamiliar words using letter-sound patterns when reading. Segmentation is the opposite of blending and is the skill of splitting a word apart. It is crucial for spelling (encoding) since being able to split words up into their separate speech sounds helps to spell unfamiliar words. If children haven't adequately learnt the first step of reading, phonemic awareness, they will be unable to blend, segment and decode successfully. When they see a word or part of a word it does not register as familiar so it cannot activate its sound. You can see why a phonics check in Year 1, an auditory test to check for phonemic awareness, is so important in identifying children at risk of a reading difficulty.

Teaching phonics involves explicitly teaching children to understand phoneme/grapheme relationships. The English language is based on the alphabetical principle. About 85% of our words are regular and can be decoded and 15% are irregular and must be learnt by sight. You can see why phonics is so powerful. Phonics leads to the best gains in teaching reading and spelling. Unfortunately, not all Australian schools use a synthetic phonics approach to teaching reading. Children usually bring home sight words to learn by rote. These are high frequency words in the English language like 'come' and 'the' and they may have irregular spelling so they are difficult to decode. Learning to instantly recognise highly frequent and irregularly spelled words helps students to develop fluency in reading and prevents students from attempting to decode words that do not contain typical letter-sound patterns. Teaching sight words before children have learnt basic decoding skills is not recommended.

# The Great Hub Easter Egg Hunt

On Thursday April 9th, 2020, the SRC Executive Team will be hosting the Great Hub Easter Egg Hunt. Classes will be given an allocated time to explore our Nature Play Area while hunting for Easter eggs. Upon completion of the hunt, classes will return to their classrooms where eggs will be evenly distributed to each child.

In order for this special event to happen we will be seeking donations of dairy milk, standard sized eggs. Donations can

be placed in the green crate outside of Room 18 or in the box in front office. Should you not wish for your child to

participate, please speak to their classroom teacher.
