FREE HOME INTERNET ACCESS

Students and families who have inadequate or no access to internet at home are eligible to apply for a free internet connection to support learning.

There are 2 options available to eligible families:

· wireless internet access from the Department for Education through the student home internet program

· NBN broadband internet access until December 2025 from the Australian Government through the School Student Broadband Initiative.

You might be eligible if you:

· have a school aged child

· don't have reliable home internet access or have no active NBN broadband connection.

SCHOOL FEES

Materials and Service Charge

Tax Invoices for the 2024 Materials and Services Charge have been posted out. The package includes an invoice, a statement, an information letter plus an agreement form for payment by instalments. Payments by instalments form is optional for those who prefer to pay in smaller amounts. Please contact us if you do not receive the package from your child or if you'd like to speak to us regarding payment plans/difficulties.

Families who still have outstanding fees for 2023 will soon receive soon a Final Notice. The fees are legally recoverable and will be forward to the Dept. for Education Debt Recovery Unit.

NAPLAN 2024

In week 7 on Wednesday 13th March - Monday 25th March Year 3 and 7 students will be participating in the National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy testing.NAPLAN is one aspect of student assessment, it does not replace ongoing assessment made by teachers about student performance.

Although students are not expected to study for NAPLAN, you can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests; however, it is not necessary for parents/ carers to do this as teachers will ensure students are supported as needed.

Adjustments are avaliable for students with a disability and for those students who have diverse functional abilities and needs. I have met with individual teachers to identify students who may require adjustments, as to reflect the support they would normally receive for in-class assessments.

If for some reason you would not like your child to participate in NAPLAN testing please complete a NAPLAN withdrawl form from the Front Office.

To Parents/Caregivers,

In addition to my Performing Arts role, I am pleased to introduce myself as the Autism Inclusion Teacher here at the Aberfoyle Hub Primary School. As part of a new nation-leading effort, every public primary school in South Australia is required to appoint an Autism Inclusion Teacher. Continuing on from last year, I am excited to be part of this pioneering initiative in South Australian Schools, that aims to enhance teacher understanding and knowledge in supporting autistic children and young people.

I draw upon my extensive background and expertise in special education and stay current with the latest developments and best practices through formal and informal professional learning during fortnightly meetings, and active collaboration within the Autism Network. I will be in the role ½ day per week where I aim to upskill all staff at the Hub by assisting and supporting them by providing them with best practise ideas and contemporary evidence-based resources to ensure best outcomes for all our students with autism.



As part of my commitment to the AIT role I will be providing regular newsletter articles with some useful information, strategies and tips for supporting children with Autism to further support and strengthen home-school connections.

I look forward to working with staff, students and families this year to help the Hub Primary School provide a more inclusive environment for all our students with autism.


Why Reading Matters

Parents/caregivers of Early Years students may notice that words and passages for decoding practice are now sent home for initial reading homework instead of readers. Readers will be sent home with students to read once they have mastered decoding the phonics code. However, regular reading to your child is still strongly encouraged as this exposes them to vocabulary and can foster a love of reading.

Reading matters!

If a student starts reading for 20 minutes per night in Reception, by the end of Year 6 Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days and Student C for just 3 school days. To motivate nightly reading for 20 minutes, all students at Aberfoyle Hub Primary School are expected to participate in, and complete, the Premier's Reading Challenge.
