# **CLASS PLACEMENT 2020**

Class planning for 2020 is now well on the way with staff and Leadership looking at our numbers, including funding for the new school year. At this point I am pleased to announce that we will be moving forwards with 11 mainstream classes and our 2 Special Classes.

Our 2020 class structure will be:

- Two Reception/Year 1 Classes
- One Year 1/2 Class
- One Year 2/3 Class
- One Year 3/4 Class
- Two Year 4/5 Classes
- One Year 5/6 Class
- Three Year 6/7 Classes

Health and Physical Education, Spanish and Music/Drama will also be offered across the school. I will report in our next school newsletter details about the Language survey.

We will soon begin to finalise teacher allocation across the school. I am currently working with the Department for Education on staffing for the new school year.

# Year 7 Transition to High School 2022

Year 7 public school students will be taught in high school from Term 1, 2022. This means that from 2022, Year 6 will be the last year of primary school and Year 7 will be the first year of high school. The move will align South Australia's public schools with the national curriculum taught in high schools making it easier to deliver subjects and allow student to access specialist educators. Access to dedicated facilities and resources and exposure to different teaching styles will also give each Year 7 student opportunities for deeper learning, greater peer interactions and greater independence and responsibility.

We will begin next year to plan for the upcoming changes as the move of our Year 7 students will have direct impact on the school name and implications for our Year 6 students who in 2021 will also be moving to High school in 2022 as Year 7 Students.

# DYSLEXIA SA: FUN PHONICS Fact 30 - Greek Words

English is a rich combination of many different languages that have evolved over time. We have elements of Greek, Saxon, Latin, Old-English and French, just to name a few. The roots of our alphabet go back to ancient Greece. The Greek system (750BC) was the first to satisfy all the conditions of a true alphabet - symbols that represent speech sounds. The Greeks refined their alphabet on another ancient system of symbols representing sounds from the Phoenicians (hence the word phonics). Two well-known graphemes that we still use today from ancient Greece are 'ph' and 'y'. The Greeks used 'ph' as the grapheme for the 'f' sound and 'y' for the 'i' sound as their alphabet did not include the letters F and I. Common words we see these ancient graphemes in today include: dolphin, elephant, graph, phase, python, gym, type.

The study of the origin of words is called etymology. It is interesting to learn how our written language evolved (recommended read: Proust and the Squid by Maryanne Wolf).

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
