All terms are quite busy, with a great amount of people supporting schools in assisting staff to cater for the learning needs of our children. The support of volunteers is invaluable in enabling the running of sporting activities, lunch-time student clubs and other school initiatives.

COVID-19 has generated a number of challenges for everyone this year. The cooperation of the school community in supporting the measures taken by the school and the Department for Education to keep everyone safe, has been particularly appreciated. As a community, we have faced many challenges and we will continue to do so as we navigate any emerging roadblocks that may come our way.

Next term we will begin to plan for a number of our traditional events such as Graduation and school performances. Further updates will be shared with the school community.

External Review

I am pleased to share that last week, on Monday 14th and Tuesday 15th September, our school had its External Review. Initial feedback from the panel was quite positive and two glowing areas in our data showed that we have done very well with student learning in Reading and Numeracy. Data trends, both in NAPLAN and Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT), have shown continued growth with particular success in our school going against the State trend with reading growth occurring in middle primary to upper primary, as compared to the State.

We expect final recommendations to soon be made, guiding us for the next three years. Once Governing Council has received the report and signed off on it, we will be sharing it with you via our school web page.

Staffing for Term 4

Leading into Term 4 we will have some staffing changes. Due to ongoing personal issues for Jane Richardson, our Spanish teacher, Mr Joaquin Giner Correas will continue on in the role as our Spanish teacher for Term 4. This allows us to provide consistency for all of our children for the remainder of the year.

Cherinah Adderton will be re-joining us during Term 4 in Room 16. Welcome back Mrs Adderton. Larissa Stella will be in Room 16 from Monday to Wednesday and Mrs Adderton on Thursday and Friday.

We are also able to confirm that Lyndall Brown will not be returning for Term 4. Shelley O'Driscoll will see out the year in Room 1. We wish Lyndall Brown all the best with her recovery.

Class Placement

The class placement process will begin early next term in readiness for 2021. Every year we aim to arrange the following year's class groupings to meet the learning needs of students and the skills and teaching styles of our teachers. When planning classes consideration is given to estimated enrolments, class numbers and gender balance. When allocating students to classes, teachers take into account friendship groups, special needs, learning styles and balance of class groupings. Every effort is made to place students with at least one friend.

Term 3 Bully Audit

Our students have participated in the second bully audit for the year. 'Bullies' are those students identified 3 or more times on the individual class summary sheets. 73% of the students said they have not been recently bullied, 62% have asked for help and 53% said they would still like further help with the issue. Two students were identified as 'bullies' from the whole-school audit. Similarly to the Term 1 audit, these incidences which primarily occurred at in class and at play times on the oval and in the courtyard involved name calling/ teasing. One student from this audit was identified in the Term 1 audit.

Leadership and staff are continuing to work with the identified 'bullies', their families and teachers to modify their behaviour and provide positive strategies for them to be successful and for other students to feel safe around them. Please remember that it is always best to talk to us as soon as possible should any issues arise so they can be dealt with as they occur.

ACER PAT Testing

All Year 1-7's have now completed the mandated online PAT testing in both Literacy and Numeracy and from Year 3-7 testing in Science as well as Vocabulary. PAT testing in literacy and numeracy occurs in all schools between DfE Weeks 7 and 10 of Term 3 every year and this year early. They are useful tools to inform teaching and learning and help monitor progress of students.



Fun Phonics Fact 20: Compound Words

An easy one for today after teaching the schwa! A compound word is two smaller words joined together. For syllable division we always split between each word. There are usually 4 consonants between vowels in compound words e.g. dish/cloth, grand/child, with/stand, match/box, grand/slam, crank/shaft.

Fun Phonics Fact 21: The 2 Sounds of Suffix S & the 3 Sounds of Suffix ED

- S can either make a 's' or 'z' sound. S says 'z' when:
- a) S comes between two vowels e.g. rise, nose, please.
- b) When S is at the end of a short word e.g. as, has, is, his, was.
- c) When a word ends with a voiced sound eg: cars, dogs, rivers.
- d) When a word ends in the suffix ES e.g. bushes, catches, foxes.

What is a voiced sound? Some sounds are produced in our throat while others are produced in our mouth or nose. Sounds that are produced in our throat are called voiced sounds as they make our voice box vibrate. Put your fingers on your throat and say zzzz (you can feel a buzzing sound). Now say ssss (you shouldn't feel any vibration as the sound comes from your mouth). Tip - all vowel sounds vibrate!

- Suffix ED can either sound like 'ed', 'd' or 't':
- a) 'ed' is sounded when a base word ends with a 't' or a 'd' e.g. rented, welded.
- b) If the baseword ends in a voiced sound then it will say 'd' e.g. hugged, grinned.
- c) If the base word is not voiced then it will say 't' e.g. jumped, talked, mixed.


