#### **INTERVIEWS**

On Monday March 15<sup>th</sup>, a note was sent out via Skoolbag about Parent/Caregiver/ Student/Teacher interviews. Interviews are an excellent opportunity for you to discuss with your child's teacher how they are progressing during Term 1, any questions you may have for your child's class teacher and identify and learn about what your child's learning needs are.

Themes that may assist you when attending the interview may be:

- learn more about your child's academic, emotional and social development.
- · meet and get to know your child's teach-
- help your child's teachers understand more about your child.
- make plans with the teacher about how you can both support your child.

I highly recommend that you book yourself in to meet the teacher, visit your child's class and discuss how your child/ren are progressing at school.

#### NAPLAN 2021

During Term 2 all Year 3, 5 and 7 students will be sitting for NAPLAN testing. Last year due to COVID, all NAPLAN testing was cancelled due to COVID constraints. Further information will be sent out as we approach NAPLAN testing during Term 2. Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students sit the test and it provides schools with a measure of growth data over an 8-year period.

This data is the only national data that we have and is quite helpful for teachers when planning in order to meet student learning needs.

Teachers and schools however do collect data from a variety of programs and learning exercises that also help support and complete an overall picture of what each child's learning needs are. PAT testing in Science, Reading and Maths are other ways we collect data. Running Records and Lexiles are reading-centred. Class teachers also collect baseline data, assess students in class and collect many other forms of data through observations.

The NAPLAN test is a snapshot on the day and does not provide educators with a complete picture of their learning needs. As we come closer to testing time, you may wish to have a talk with your child's classroom teacher about the test.

#### Upcoming Sports Day

On Thursday, April 1st we will be holding Sports Day. We are looking forward to seeing families come and join us for Sports day. Further information will be sent out about the day. It will be a little different due to COVID safety measures.

Specific toilets will be set aside for adults, QR codes will be around the school as there will be an expectation that everyone does sign in. We all will need to remain vigilant and make sure that we are all adhering to social distancing rules.

I look forward to seeing our families attend the day. A reminder also, if the weather does not work in our favour, the back-up Sports Day is set for Thursday, 8<sup>th</sup> April.

#### **BULLY AUDIT**

We are committed to creating a supportive school environment, free from bullying, harassment and violence. Our message is that we say 'no way' to bullying in all shapes and forms including cyber bullying, physical violence and intimidation. There is no place for bullying or violence in or outside of our schools. We continually encourage children to talk about and be more aware of the impacts of bullying.

# MANAGING BULLYING AT THE HUB

It is important for our school community to continuously look at ways to monitor and improve procedures to reduce harassment and bullying incidents. Research shows bullying can have a significant impact on learning and relationships if not dealt with effectively. To further strengthen our work in ensuring that our school is a safe, happy and harassment-free environment for students, staff and families we will conduct an R-7 Bullying Audit in Week 9 this term and again in Term 3.

#### What is a Bully Audit?

The audit involves students completing a series of questions with support of their class teacher, asking them if they've been bullied recently including what and where it happened.

# What happens with this information?

Conversations will be had with students identified through this process. Discussions centre on what needs to improve/change to support positive behaviour. Sometimes students can be involved in bullying without realising that their actions affect others. Data collected is used to inform and improve our practice in order to keep our school a safe place for all.

#### Will families be notified?

Families will be informed if their child is identified through the process and a meeting arranged where applicable.

#### COVID-19 GUIDELINES - SPORTS DAY 2021

We are excited to welcome back parents/caregivers to this year's Sports Day. However, to ensure the safety of our students, staff and community the following guidelines must be adhered to:

All visitors to our site are required to check in either using the electronic QR code (located at
the front/back gate and throughout the school), or manually signing in on the form provided at
the front and back gate. This is to assist SA Health with contact tracing if required.

Children aged 0-12 are not required to check in.

- Only students and staff are permitted to enter school buildings (including the Hall).
   Unless accessing toilets (see below).
- The Unit 1 toilets (near canteen) will be the dedicated toilet block for all visitors to use.
- Social distancing must be practiced throughout the day
- Hand sanitiser will be available at the front/back gate, scorers tent, canteen and Unit 1 toilets.
