ANNUAL ACER PAT TESTING

A reminder that currently and until the end of the term all Year 1-7's will be completing online PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) testing in both Reading and Maths and Year 3-7's testing in Science and Vocabulary. The tests are online and will occur daily before recess. All students are required to complete PAT tests. They are part of the data collection process that schools use to help monitor progress of students to inform teaching and learning. PAT testing in literacy and numeracy occurs in all Department for Education schools between Weeks 7 and 10 of Term 3 each year. Please contact your child's class teacher, Tas Ktenidis or Sarah Magnusson should you have any questions.

BULLY AUDIT: Term 3 Dealing with Bullying in our Schools

During Week 9 of this term we will be conducting our second Bullying Audit with all Reception to Year 7 classes. We are committed to creating a supportive environment free from bullying, harassment and violence. Your child will be participating by completing the Bully Audit Form online. Information that the students provide will be collated and conversations will be had by class teachers and leadership with any students who are identified by their peers through this process. Discussions will focus on what needs to improve/change to support positive behavior. You will be contacted if your child has been identified through this process and a meeting arranged where applicable.



- Online orders do not require an envelope returned to your school
- Sibling Photos Don't forget to pre-order your sibling photos online up to 24 hours before photo day. We provide your school with a list of sibling orders right up to the day of photography, so no one misses out. If you miss the online order deadline, you can submit a completed sibling order envelope first thing in the morning of the day of photography, so your school is aware you want the photo taken and can bring your children together in time for it. Sibling photographs only apply to children enrolled at your school. Please note not all schools offer sibling photos
- Late fees a late fee will be applied to each package purchased after photo day due to the additional cost of producing these packages separately
- Package delivery photographic packages will be returned to your school for distribution approximately six weeks after photos are taken
