NAPLAN

Students will soon come home with their NAPLAN results. This is a great time to look at their achievements. Our current year 5 and year 7 students who sat for NAPLAN in 2019, you will be able to measure and see what growth they have achieved. For our year 3 cohort, this data will assist us greatly in our planning for Numeracy and Literacy learning outcomes.

Preliminary results indicate that our students have maintained achievement levels to 2019 and in some circumstance have shown slight growth. As a State overall NAPLAN results have provided a positive snap shot in our learning journey. The message from our Chief Executive highlighted some real positive gains.

Notably we have achieved:

- SA's highest ever mean scores in:
 - $\circ\,$ Reading Year 3 and 5
 - Spelling Year 3 and 5
 - Numeracy Year 5
- SA's highest ever percentage of students scoring in the highest test band in:
 - $\circ\,$ Reading Year 3 and 5 $\,$
 - Numeracy Year 5 and 7
 - $\circ\,$ Spelling Year 3 and 5 $\,$
- SA's year 9 writing mean scores are higher than the Australian mean scores

We will continue to supporting our students learning and we look forward to seeing further evidence in our children's learning growth from Reading lexiles, Running Records, PAT data and Phonics results.

School Uniforms

Our school, like all surrounding schools has a School Uniform policy. The expectation is that when students come to school, they are required to wear school uniform with the correct school colours. Aberfoyle Hub Primary school colours are: navy blue, pale blue and white.

Black is **not** part of our school uniform and we would like to remind families to please make sure children are not sent to school in the wrong colours. We understand at times, there may be special reasons for your child not to be able to attend school in correct colours. Under such circumstance, please communicate this with your child's teacher.
