OUT OF SCHOOL SPORTS 2022

Around 40 per cent of Australian children don't participate in sport at all.

Benefits of sport for children include:



- reduced risk of obesity
- increased cardiovascular fitness
- healthy growth of bones, muscles, ligaments and tendons
- improved coordination and balance
- a greater ability to physically relax and, therefore, avoid the complications of chronic muscular tension (such as headache or back ache)
- improved sleep
- mental health benefits, such as greater confidence

- improved personal skills, including cooperation and leadership.

THE SPANISH UPDATE BY JOAQUIN GINER SPANISH TEACHER

Señor

This week we are going to talk about a very special day for the Hispanic community. On October 12, el Día de la Hispanidad is celebrated, also known as Columbus Day or Day of Cultures. In many Latin American countries, it is known as Día de la Raza (Day of the Race), especially since native Americans were not treated well by Columbus and other European explorers and settlers. This day commemorates the moment when Cristopher Columbus or Cristóbal Colón (in Spanish) set foot in America for the first time on October 12, 1492, which was a great milestone in the recent history of mankind, since it allowed the opening of new trade routes and established the bases for future European settlements in America.

But not everyone is happy about these celebrations. Most indigenous cultures all across the Americas recognize the day as the start of the erosion of their cultures. The day for them represents the invasion of their land by Europeans. We can compare this day to the day Australia was colonized by the English. The Native Americans suffered the effects of the diseases carried by the Europeans and their lust for power and desire to indoctrinate the Native Americans in their own culture.

Some facts that maybe you did not know:

Christopher Columbus was born in Genoa (Italy), not in Spain. However, there are theories that he may have originated in Spain or even in Poland or Greece.

He Made Four Journeys to the "New World".

Native Americans are also known as "Indians" due to the fact that Cristóbal Colón wanted to go to India, and when he arrived in America, he thought it was India. So, when he saw the Native Americans for the first time, that is the name he gave them.

He was still travelling even after his death: after Columbus died in 1506, he was buried in Valladolid, Spain. Three years later his remains were taken to his family mausoleum, which was in Sevilla. In 1542, in accordance with the will of his son Diego, Columbus's remains were transferred to Santo Domingo, Hispaniola (now in the Dominican Republic). Hispaniola was ceded to France by Spain, and in 1795 Columbus's bones were moved to Havana, Cuba. More than a hundred years later they were shipped back across the Atlantic and returned to Sevilla in 1898. In week 1 Term 4, students were learning about this topic in Spanish class. Go and ask them about who was Cristóbal Colón and what did he do. Nos vemos


