Medication

Notes will also be sent home with students as a reminder, together with new Medication Authority forms. These forms should be completed and returned to the Front Office at the start of the new 2022 school year.

Please note that it is the Parent/Caregivers' responsibility to collect their child's medication from the Front Office by Friday 10th December, 2021. We ask that you take the time to update any health care plans and check that all medication is still in date.

All Medications must be prescribed by an Authorised Health Professional and be in an original pharmacy-labelled container. All details on the pharmacy label must correlate with the Medication Agreement form. Medication will not be given if any of the information differs.

Medications continued

Who is responsible for providing Medication to the Education and Care Service?

The parent or guardian is responsible for providing all medication and administration equipment. They should be encouraged to give and collect any medication in person where possible.

Where this is not possible, the education and care staff, in consultation with the parent or guardian, should discuss and agree on safe methods of transport and transfer.

As previously stated. All medications must be provided in an original pharmacy container and have a pharmacy label with:

- child or young person's name
- date of dispensing
- name of medication
- strength of medication
- dose (how much to give)
- when the dose should be given
- other administration instructions (such as to be taken with food)

 expiry date (where there is no expiry date the medication must have been dispensed within the last 6 months).

First Dose

Due to the dangers of an adverse reaction the first dose must be supervised by a parent, guardian or health professional.

2022 MATERIALS & SERVICE CHARGES COMMUNITY MEETING




