Question-Answer Relationship strategy to Reading

In the third update about QAR strategy to reading, we look at what good readers do after they have read a body of text.

After reading good readers will;

· Construct a mental or actual summary of what they have read

 Reflect on what and how they have read. Question prompts can be divide into three areas; Think and search, Author and me and On my own.

Think and Search:

· What were the important events in the story? Author and me:

- · At the beginning you predicted.....
- What was the author's message?
- · Do you really think this will happen in real life? Tell me why.....

On my own:

Would you like to find another story about...?

More question prompts that you can assist your child with when reading can include; Plot

- · What is the main problem in the story?
- · How is the problem solved?
- · Can you retell the story and include the Introduction
- · complication and resolution? (or problem and solution.
- Can you come up with a different ending?

Reflection

- · Does this story remind you of anything?
- Did you enjoy the story?
- What did you like/ not like about the story?
- Will you read other stories by the same author? Why? Why not?

NAPLAN Week 2, Term 2



Our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be sitting for NAPLAN testing during next term, week 2 from the 10th May to 20th May 2022. Students in year 3 have recently experienced an online practice session in which they were able to develop an understanding what the test conditions will be like. NAPLAN is a national assessment that tests students' ability in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Science at the Hub




