#### **House Teams**

Aberfoyle Hub introduced last week a house teams system. The purpose of house teams is for student recognition on their personal efforts and whole school community involvement. All students have been allocated to the four existing house teams. A note will soon come home informing you in what team your child will be in.

The four teams which are our historical student teams are; Sauerbier (Red), Warrakilla (Blue), Appleton (Yellow) and Nicolle (Green). Students will be competing for an overall shield that will be presented to the winning team at the end of each school year. These teams will also be the same teams that will compete for Sports day.

The House team shield will not replace the Sports day shields. Both Sports day shields will remain as part of Sports day competition and be celebrated on that day. Students will be able to earn points for their team.

Three categories are Sports which will account for 30% towards shield success. Examples for points in Sport can be; Sports day, Pedal Prix, SAPSASA, Out of school sport, Lunch Clubs.

The second category is Academic achievement. This accounts for 30% towards shield success. Examples for points can be; academic achievement, academic improvement and outstanding pieces of work. The final category is Community/ School values. This will account for 40% of shield points. Examples in earning points can be; service to the school community, Inter-school competition involvement, positive behaviour, acts of kindness, positive attitude, music/dance drama involvement and canteen work.

Student leaders being our SRC executives and Sports Captains and Vice Captains will also be part, with staff in allocating points for the above categories. As student leaders, they have an opportunity to be positive role models for their peers and be able to give recognition for positive efforts by their peers.

I look forward to celebrating student success throughout the year and our first winning house at the end of the year. Good luck to all students.
