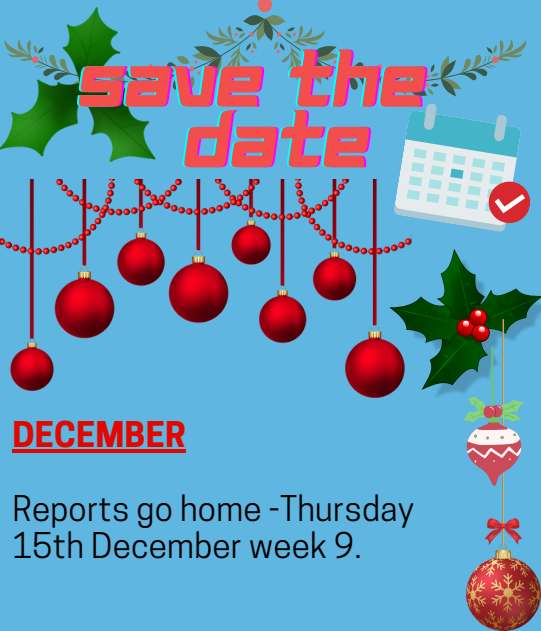

### **MEDICATION**

Just a reminder that any medication your child has at school must be collected by 2:30pm on the last day of Term 4, 2022.

Medication Authority forms have been sent home with students. These forms should be completed and returned to the Front Office at the start of the new 2023 school year. Parents are requested to sign medication out in person when collecting from Front Office.

We ask that you take the time to update any health care plans and check that all medication is still in date. All Medications must be prescribed by an Authorized Health Professional and be in an original pharmacy-labelled container.

### **NON DEPARTMENT SERVICE PROVIDERS 2023**

Forms are now available from Front Office for families to access their Occupational or Speech Therapists during school hours. Due to the popularity of this service we ask that parents/caregivers limit their requests to one service provider per family. This will allow a more equitable system with families able to access service providers on sight.

Please note all Service Providers will need to show proof of being double vaccinated.

Service Providers will then be able to start requesting times from week 1, however sessions will not be able to commence until week 4. We ask for your patience and understanding working through this complex process to best meet all service provider requests.

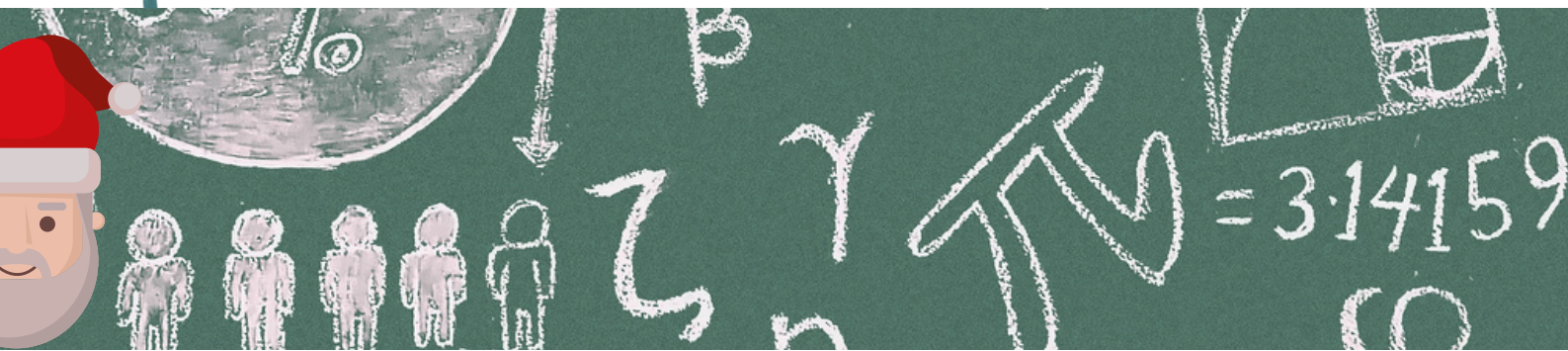

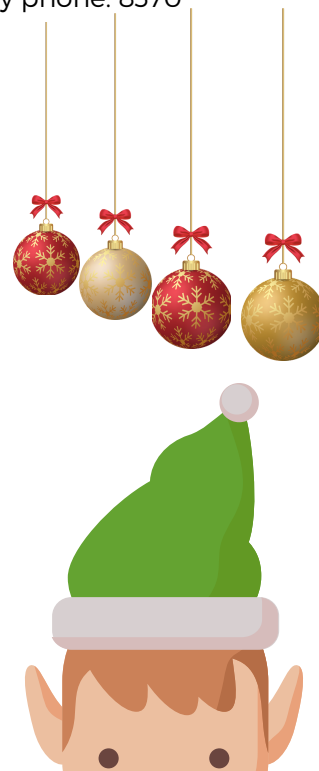
