Congratulations to Kerry Heil who has won the Deputy Principal position until Friday July 2023.

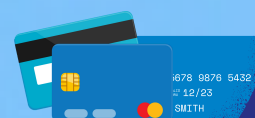
We look forward to Kerry joining the Hub Community on Monday 20th March.

As part of the Health and PE curriculum, R-4 students will be involved in a 1-week daily swimming program this term.

Invoices and medical/consent forms will be sent home to families this week 4 as well as further details about swimming times, requirements and timetables.

Cost for R-4 students is \$39 (no GST included in the cost). This includes the entrance fees and bus service lessons are cost-free (as it is part of the curriculum). Payment must be made by Friday, March 17th.

Intervention Program

MultiLit (Making Up Lost Time In Literacy)

Welcome to Macq Lit- years 3 – 6.

Our lessons include letter sounds and names, the first 100 sight words, de-coding and syllables, which help us to read bigger/ more difficult words, digraphs, phonemes, graphemes, plus much more.

We read books and paragraphs, we also read/ write words and sentences during lesson time.

Students are encouraged to read to an adult at home 3-4 times a week for 20 minutes to boost and practice their learning.

Some students work 1:1 with a trained SSO and others in small groups.

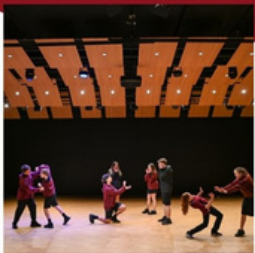
