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From the Principal by Sarah Magnusson

Dear Parents/Caregivers.

Reading fluently is essential to reading comprehension. The ability to identify letters and decode words enables reading accuracy which leads to reading fluently which leads to reading comprehension, increased reading, which leads to increased vocabulary and background knowledge.

Recent Pupil Free Day – Staff Training

Ginny Pryor from the Literacy Guarantee Unit gave a workshop in the morning on Vocabulary and Morphology to all our staff. Ginny then trained student support staff in literacy intervention a very useful resource that can be used across all year levels.

As mentioned in previous newsletters our Teaching staff have been focusing on developing our skills in reading and learning how to implement a range of literacy tests known as DIBELS. This is a diagnostic tool that can monitor students at risk and identify if students are on track with a variety of reading skills. This Friday Kylie Clark, Kate Zampogna, Kerry Heil and myself will be receiving additional coaching training to support our staff use of DIBELS data and strategies in classrooms.

This will help to strengthen our approach to meeting our reading goal documented on our School Improvement Plan.

Student-Led Conferences

All families will have received a letter sent out earlier this week inviting you to book a 15 minute time to hear your child/ren talk about their learning journey from next Tuesday 28th March - Monday 3rd April.

A student-led conference is similar to parent/caregiver - teacher interview, but the student is present and in charge of leading the discussion. The Teacher acts as a facilitator for the discussion. The student demonstrates responsibility for their academic performance by providing a review of their work for parents/caregivers and Teachers.

BULLY AUDIT

We are committed to creating a supportive school environment, free from bullying, harassment and violence. Our message is that we say 'No way' to bullying in all shapes and forms including cyber bullying, physical violence and intimidation. There is no place for bullying or violence in or outside of our schools. We continually encourage children to talk about and be more aware of the impacts of bullying.

MANAGING BULLYING AT THE HUB

It is important for our school community to continuously look at ways to monitor and improve procedures to reduce harassment and bullying incidents. Research shows bullying can have a significant impact on learning and relationships if not dealt with effectively. To further strengthen our work in ensuring that our school is a safe, happy and harassment-free environment for students, staff and families we will conduct a whole school Bullying Audit in Week 9 this term and again in Term 3.

What is a Bully Audit?

The audit involves students completing a series of questions with support of their class teacher, asking them if they've been bullied recently including what and where it happened; What happens with this information?

Conversations will be had with students identified through this process. Discussions centre on what needs to improve/change to support positive behaviour. Sometimes students can be involved in bullying without realising that their actions affect others. Data collected is used to inform and improve our practice in order to keep our school a safe place for all. Will families be notified? Families will be informed if their child is identified through the process and a meeting arranged where applicable. Please read the letter to be emailed (Friday March 25th) to families, detailing the Bully Audit process. For further information contact your child's teacher, Sarah Magnusson or Kerry Heil.

Intervention Program



MEETING INITIAL NEEDS IN LITERACY

MiniLit Sage is a literacy intervention program designed for young children, Years 1 and 2 who are struggling to learn to read. The program is designed to be delivered to small groups of up to four children.

What is involved in the MiniLit Sage program?

Small groups of children work for 45 minutes, four-five times a week using the carefully. structured MiniLit Sage program materials.



Each lesson has two distinct areas of instruction:

-Working with Sounds and Words where children are explicitly taught the relationship between sounds and letters and how this knowledge is critical to reading.

Practice and Application

- where further opportunities are provided for the children to practise their reading skills using a variety of activities and resources.


