### Reading

Teachers are using a new SUITE of assessments" DIBELS". These are conducted at the beginning, middle and at the end of the year, to track students progress.

Teachers have been busy analyzing their class results of DIBELS assessments conducted at the end of last term. They are now focusing on developing student's fluency in reading which will then in turn support their reading comprehension.

Families can support developing their child/ren fluency in reading by;

-Listening to them read daily.

-If your child is either a reluctant reader or lacks

confidence in their reading then read to them.

-Read the same book several times or ask them to read after you.

All of these activities are important to develop reading. DI

### Staff Communicating With Families During the Day

Class dojo is a fantastic safe way of connecting teachers, students and families through various communication features such as photos and videos from the school day as well as messaging.

We encourage strong communication to continue between school and families.

Teachers regularly share and celebrate your child's learning in a variety of ways using dojo and other forums. We do this well at the Hub.

Teachers' will respond to any communication received by families in a timely manner, however, please be mindful that teaching your children is the number one priority for all, during the school day.

### **Skoolbag Retirement**

A reminder that all families have been informed last week that the Hub will now be using EdSmart to make communication between schools and families more streamlined.

EdSmart is a DFE digital system that replaces Skoolbag and all those paper forms we used to send home for you to complete and return. It is an Australian tool trusted by hundreds of schools to improve communication in the school community. Hard copy forms will still be available from the Front Office.

Best of all, it does all the work. You do not need to download any apps or remember extra passwords, registrations or logins.

### Parking / KISS'N'DROP Zone

The safety of our students - your children are always of utmost concern to us .

Thank you to parents/caregivers who are using parking zones correctly before/after school - by pulling up, dropping off and leaving immediately. This minimises any congestion/safety issues.

In a 'Kiss and drop' zone:

- The zone is for the drop off or collection of passengers only.
- Vehicles must not be in these areas for more than 2 minutes.
- Drivers must not leave a vehicle unattended in these zones.

If your child is not waiting when you arrive to collect them, drive off and leave the zone free for parents/caregivers whose child is waiting.

Everyone's patience is appreciated during these peak times when space is hard to find. We ask parents/caregivers to park within the lines and, in the afternoons, refrain from using the drop-off zone as a park/stop for an extended time.

Remember too, that double parking/angle parking is illegal and unsafe and that local residents need to be able to have safe and unrestricted access to their properties.

For safety reasons, parents/caregivers should <u>not</u> use staff car parks. Students are to use the paths and small access gates. Walking through the car park is not permitted.

Please remember that our Disability Car Parks (permit holders only) located in the school grounds means NO pedestrian ACCESS in this area.

Our local Council does send out Parking Inspectors and were seen last week patrolling the area. Parking inappropriately can be a <u>costly</u> mistake.

### Students on School grounds before/after school.

A reminder that students are not permitted on the school grounds before 8:30am as there is no teacher on duty. All students are required to be picked up by 3.30pm.

Please contact OSHC if you need care for your child before or after school. Our OSHC opens at 6.45am and closes at 6.30pm.

## National Consistent Collection Data (NCCD)

We have commenced the annual Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability.

This involves the collection of the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students; the level of adjustment provided to students; and where known, the student's type of disability.

Under the Collection model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information about your child will be included in this year's data collection.

## Autism Inclusion Teacher

Most of you will know me in my current teaching role as the 'Performing Arts' teacher and maybe some may even remember me a few years back, as the teacher of the Junior Primary Special Class when I started around 12 years ago. This year I have been appointed the "Autism Inclusion Teacher" in 2023, in addition to my other roles within the school.

Autism Inclusion Teachers are a new, nation-leading initiative which aims to build teacher understanding and knowledge around supporting autistic children and young people.

Every public primary school in South Australia is required to appoint an Autism Inclusion Teacher whose job it will be to ensure that our students with autism receive the support they need to succeed in the classroom.

As the Autism Inclusion Teacher at our school will take on the role (1/2 day per week) from term 1, 2023. Positive Partnerships and forming ongoing collaborative

connections in the Autism Inclusion Teacher networks.

My role is to improve knowledge and drive improved teaching practice across the school in relation to Autism spectrum disorder. To assist and support teachers and staff with best practice ideas and contemporary evidence-based resources to ensure best outcomes for all our students with autism.

I will be providing regular newsletter articles with some useful information, strategies and tips for supporting children with Autism to further support and strengthen home-school connections.

## ABERFOYLE HUB PRIMARY SCHOOL AND BERRY STREET EDUCATIONAL MODEL

In today's changing world, many primary and secondary school students encounter daily challenges that can impact their success at school. Despite best efforts and intentions, schools often require specialised strategies to address student needs for healing, growth, and achievement.

Aberfoyle Hub Primary School is committed to incorporating the Berry Street Educational Model in each classroom to further strengthen relationships leading to stronger academic outcomes.

The strategies below are implemented in every classroom across our site:

### MORNING ROUTINE

Each class starts off the day with a similar routine. A greeting routine, special announcements from students and a positive primer to engage students for learning. This helps to create a consistent and predictable routine each morning.

### BRAIN BREAKS

Brain breaks are student-centred short regulatory activities that help to ready the brain for learning. Teachers use Brain Breaks strategically during lessons to provide opportunities for students to maximise their levels of engagement.

### UNCONDITIONAL POSITIVE REGARD

Unconditional positive regard provides an environment in which students feel valued, cared for and supported. It separates the student from the behaviour and provides more opportunity for growth.





## quicksmart At the HUB

The Quicksmart Numeracy program consists of three 30 minute lessons per week. Students work in pairs with a trained instructor. Each lesson consists of six short focused activities, beginning with Focus Facts, followed by Flashcards.

Flashcards are used to assist students to develop automatic recall. Students are given a specific number fact set of flashcards. The flashcard section of the lesson is a timed event. Students are asked to say the answers as quickly as possible in one minute. Once students can answer 30 flashcards, with 100% accuracy twice in a row, they are moved onto the next set of flashcards. There are 12 sets of flashcards in each operation.
