We continue with our focus of improving reading outcomes for all students at the Hub. Leadership attended further training last week, to which our staff were then upskilled in this week learning about the importance of fluency and how to increase engagement of all students using a range of strategies. All students will be reassessed at the end of this term with teachers analysing and interpreting data, then measuring growth and improvement for students within their class.

Remember,... reading, reading, reading. It is the best way to improve reading. Regular reading improves fluency. Good fluency improves reading comprehension.

How to help your child build a habit of going to preschool or school every day.



regular evening and bedtime routine and enough sleep



limit the use of electronic devices in the evenings



help your child be organised in the morning to get them to school on time



arrange alternative transport in case something unexpected happens



take family vacations during school holidays



make appointments outside of school hours or in school holidays



talk positively about school



show interest in what your child is learning, their progress and their friends



regularly communicate with your child's teacher

Covid19 Reminder.

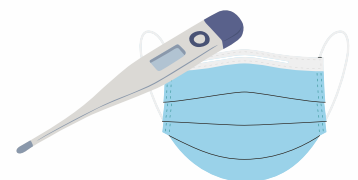
Please be reminded that students should continue to attend school as normal unless they:

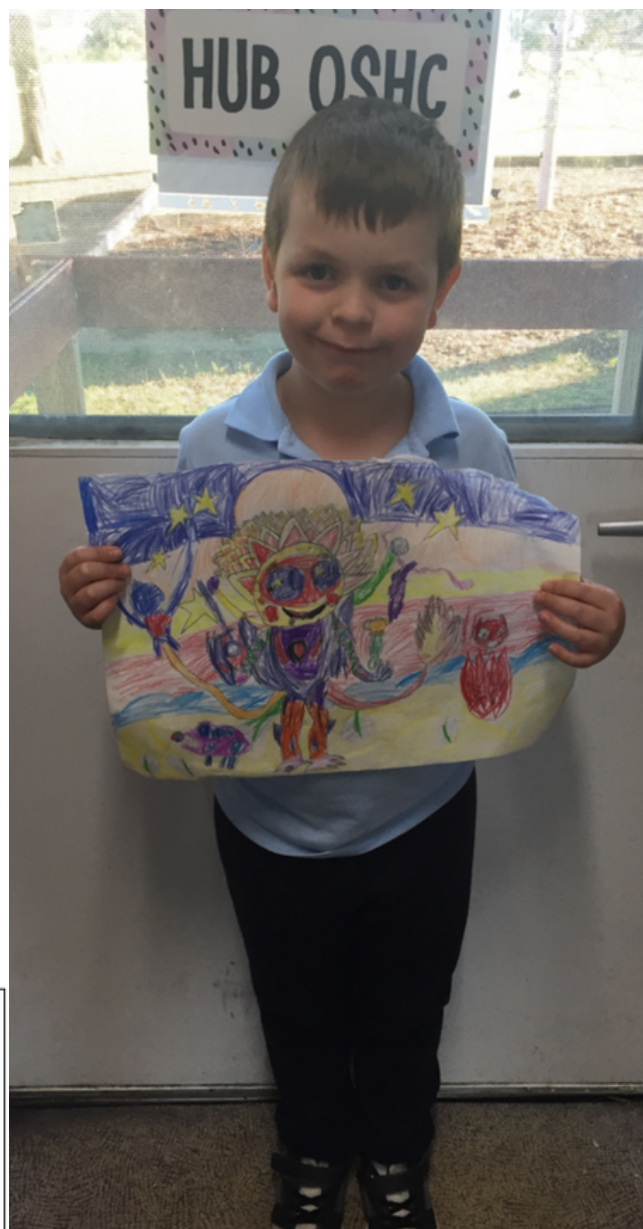

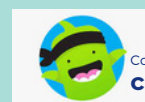
