Dear Families

WELCOME BACK TO TERM 3

I hope families enjoyed spending time with their children during the 2 week break or for those families who were unable to then hopefully your children enjoyed accessing vacation care or any other means of care.

Teachers were busy analysing their class results of DIBELS assessments that were conducted at the end of last term. From training received last term they are now focussing on developing student's fluency in reading which will then improve their reading comprehension.

Families can support your child in developing their fluency in reading by you listening to them read every day. If your child is either a reluctant reader or lacks confidence in their reading then read to them, read with them, read the same book several times or ask them to read after you.

All of these activities are important to develop reading. Teachers are looking forward to tracking growth in reading fluency and comprehension when they review our DIBELS assessments early next term.

STAFFING UPDATE

Welcome to Phillipa Dean, School Service Officer (SSO) who has recently joined the Hub staff in supporting student learning at the Hub.

We welcome Joy Sarkis to the Hub community. Joy is our Pastoral Care Worker and will be supporting the community 3 days per week - Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Please make yourself known to Joy as she is very keen to learn everyone's names.

Just as students fall ill and need to have time off from school to get well, so too do our staff. The department are currently experiencing a shortage of staffing and this is particularly noticeable as our staff are requiring time off. There have been times, and will likely occur again, when we do not have relief teachers to replace those absent. Please be assured that priority is always given to having Teachers in your child's class.

JEANETTE CRESCENT ROAD RESURFACING

Earlier this year communication went out to all families about the resealing of the road surface in Jeanette Crescent from number 12 to the dead end. We are still yet to see this occur.

We have been given further notice from the city of Onkaparinga that these works are likely to occur between now and January 2024, dependent upon weather and other possible delays. The street may need to be closed during the sealing process. Works will take 1-2 days to complete. We will be notified the week prior to reseal works commencing.

KISS'N'DROP ZONE / STAFF CAR PARK REMINDER

The safety of our students - your children are always of utmost concern to us all.

Thank you to parents/caregivers who are using parking zones correctly before/after school - by pulling up, dropping off and leaving immediately. This avoids any congestion/safety issues.

In a 'Kiss and drop' zone:

- The zone is for the drop off or collection of passengers only.
- · Vehicles must not be in these areas for more than 2 minutes.
- · Drivers must not leave a vehicle unattended in these zones. If your child is not waiting when you arrive to collect them, drive off and leave the zone free for parents/caregivers whose child is waiting.

Everyone's patience is appreciated during these peak times when space is hard to find. We ask that parents/caregivers park within the lines and, in the afternoons, refrain from using the drop-off zone as a park/stop for an extended time.

Remember too, that double parking/angle parking is illegal and unsafe and that local residents need to be able to have safe and unrestricted access to their properties.

For safety reasons, parents/caregivers should not use staff car parks. For their safety, students need to use the paths and small access gates and not walk through the car parks.

Please remember that our Disability Car Parks located in the school grounds means there is to be NO pedestrian ACCESS in this area, as cars need to have clear space to reverse out. Parking in the Disability Parks is by permit holders only.

From time to time our local Council does send out Parking Inspectors and have been seen regularly patrolling the area. Parking inappropriately can be a costly mistake.

SCHOOL VALUES

Our school values of relationships, responsibility, resilience and respect underpins who we are at the Hub. These values are routinely taught and reinforced both in classroom and outdoor learning environments throughout the school year.
