HELP FOR SENSORY OVERLOAD; EAR PLUGS FOR NEURODIVERGENT STUDENTS

Noise sensitivity comes in all shapes and sizes just like us. Some children may get overwhelmed by loud noises during assemblies, everyone talking at once, or simply get irritation and anxiety triggered from the constant hum of the air-conditioner. For some students with ADHD and ASD their noise sensitivity can cause social issues if they have trouble filtering out background noise and focusing on conversation.

I have tried the adult loops in noisy environments and found them to reduce background noise to a comfortable level while preserving clarity of speech.

They are quite small and discreet and come in a variety of noise cancelling levels and colours. These earplugs feature innovative technology, kid-friendly ear tip sizes, and come in vibrant duotone colours, making them both effective and appealing for children aged 6-12. They are specifically designed to assist those with sensitive hearing, and noise-related stress by dampening overwhelming sounds while still allowing important sounds to be heard. 
