CLASS PLACEMENT 2025

The class placement process will begin early next term in readiness for 2025. Every year we aim to arrange the following year's class groupings to meet the learning needs of students and the skills and teaching styles of our teachers. When planning classes consideration is given to estimated enrolments, class numbers and gender balance. When allocating students to classes, teachers take into account friendship groups, additional needs, learning styles and balance of class groupings. Every effort is made to place students with at least one friend. Parents/Caregivers are able to provide information that may be useful during the class placement process if they wish. While we cannot accept parents/caregivers requesting a specific teacher, we are happy to receive comments regarding your child's specific learning needs, friendship groups, social and emotional needs and any other information which could have an impact on your child's future class placement here at the Hub. It is important not to indicate to your child that you have provided information thereby leading her/him to assume the information provided will necessarily be the outcome. If you have any information that you would like to share with us about your child's education for next year, please request a form by contacting Cathrine in the front office via email cathrine.currie551@schools.sa.edu.au or phone 8270 5055. Please return the form marked **CONFIDENTIAL** to either Sarah.Magnusson893@schools.sa.edu.au or the front office no later than end of this term Friday 27th September. A further note will go out about transition for next term. Students and families will be informed of their new classes in Week 9, Term 4.

RECEPTION ENROLMENTS 2025

Please contact the school if your child is eligible to start school next year and you have not yet completed an enrolment form. If you know of any families with children eligible to enrol and have not yet done so, then please advise us as soon as possible as this information will help us to make informed decisions about class placements next year. Enrolment forms are available from the Front Office.

ANNUAL ACER PAT TESTING

A reminder that currently, and until the end of the term, all Year 1-6s will be completing online PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) testing in both Reading and Maths and Year 3-6s testing in Science and Vocabulary. The tests are online and will occur daily before recess. All students are required to complete PAT tests. They are part of the data collection process that schools use to help monitor progress of students to inform teaching and learning. PAT testing in literacy and numeracy occurs in all Department for Education schools between Weeks 8 and 10 of Term 3 each year. Please contact your child's class teacher, Sarah Magnusson or Amanda Allen should you have any questions.

OPTIONAL INTERVIEWS

Although teacher interviews are optional this term, if you would like to meet with your child's classroom or specialist teacher to discuss their progress, please book a time by contacting your child's teacher or Cathrine at the Front Office.

BULLY AUDIT

During week 9 and 10 of this term, all students R-6 will complete the term 3 Bully Audit to support safe and positive behaviour. We conduct the Bully Audit twice a year and use the results to conduct conversations and learning opportunities with all students involved. A letter will also be sent out to families.

It has been coordinated centrally so that added administration workload isn't placed on the school.

Your answers won't identify you or your child. Only collated feedback will be provided to our school.

Information collected will inform school improvement planning and activities at the school.

The survey closes midnight Sunday 8th September.

Where can I park?

Kiss'n'Drop Zone -(located outside the front of the school clearly sign posted with broken red lines).

School Uniform Expectation

A reminder that all students are expected to be in school uniform when at school. We strongly encourage all families to support the school in ensuring students attend in full school uniform colours - plain navy blue, light blue and white.



Lost Property

There is an abundance of lost property accumulating around the school. Please check the lost property bins near the Multi-Purpose room for any missing items.



It has been lovely having a couple of warm days over the last few weeks, giving us all a little teaser that Spring is almost here. With the warmer days approaching we all want our students to be able to learn and play outdoors, but as educators we need to support all of our students to know the risk of UV. By teaching sensible sun protection habits from an early age and implementing sun protection measure, together we play a significant role in reducing skin cancer risk.

To continue to be a SunSmart School we have recently updated our SunSmart Policy. Some of the key changes to the policy include:

- **Sunscreen:** parents are encouraged to send their child to school with sunscreen already applied, and provide a SPF50+ broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen to bring to school. Many chemists sell small clip-on sunscreen bottles for bags which would be ideal. Strategies are in place to remind and encourage students to reapply sunscreen before going outdoors during the day.
- **School curriculum:** Sun protection and UV safety education is incorporated into the curriculum for all year levels.

We appreciate your ongoing support with helping ensure all our students are protected from over-exposure to UV radiation.
