#### **NAPLAN**

Parents and carers of students in Years 3 and 5 who took this year's NAPLAN assessment in March have received an individual student report of their child's results from school. NAPLAN shows how students are going all over Australia. These reports provide useful information on a student's results in Reading, Writing, Conventions of Language (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) and Numeracy. NAPLAN individual student reports are reported against four proficiency standards - exceeding, strong, developing and needs additional support. The standards are set at a challenging but reasonable expectation of what students know and can do at the time of testing. Along with other school assessment reports, parents and carers can use the NAPLAN individual student reports to discuss their child's progress with their teacher.

Join us for special Book Week craft sessions during Recess on:



#### **Pre Service Teachers and Social Work Students**

Every year we are lucky enough to host students from universities within Adelaide for their placements. We also welcome 2 new Social Work Students, Grace and Sarah.

#### **ICAS** testing

In Weeks 3 - 5, we have 5 students participating in ICAS Assessments in Digital Technology, Maths, Spelling Bee, Writing, Science and English. It's an annual, online, academic competition for students in Years 3-12, assessing their ability to apply classroom learning to new situations using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. We are looking forward to hearing about their achievements later in the year.

#### Safe Driving - 25kmph - School Zone
