From the Principal by Sarah Magnusson

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Welcome back to the final busy term of the year. Whilst there are many events on our school calendar that we are preparing for, we remain focussed on delivering a rich engaging curriculum with our goal of increasing reading achievement of all students.

School Value - Responsibility

Responsibility fosters trust, accountability, and growth across students, families, and the broader community. It empowers everyone to contribute positively and encourages active involvement within our school environment and beyond.

Classes 2026

Planning is well underway for next year. Although we are resourced for 8 classes, Governing Council have approved funding for a 9 class model. This allows for greater opportunities for students with their learning.

Research continues to provide substantial evidence that smaller classes does have enormous benefits to supporting learning outcomes for all children. Smaller class sizes allow teachers to spend more time working one on one with students. This will allow for several improved outcomes such as student/ teacher relationships and student learning experiences.

2026 MATERIALS & SERVICE CHARGES

COMMUNITY MEETING INVITATION



Our Governing Council have proposed the Materials and Services charge next year be set at \$365 per student.

This will allow us to maintain our learning programmes. A copy of the watermark notice detailing the itemised breakdown of the charge can be seen in the adjacent image.

<u>The charge will be ratified at a Governing Council</u> meeting at 6:30pm Wednesday, November 5th 2025 in the Staff Room.

The commitment by state Government of South Australia to support all student fees by offering a \$200 rebate to full paying families means that families will only be paying \$165 per student in 2026.

All Parents/Caregivers of Reception to Year 5 students are invited to attend this Governing Council meeting, to raise any questions or concerns re the proposed fee. Ratification of fees and successful polling of all parents/caregivers will allow permission to legally recover (where applicable) the full amount of the Materials and Service Charges 2026 outlined in the notice which will be sent to parents/caregivers via eldest child (Reception – Year 5) in family, before the Governing Council meeting on Wednesday 5th November.
